Where Sidewalk Vending is (and isn't) Permitted in Old Town

Does a sidewalk vendor need a permit to operate in the City of San Diego?

Yes, a sidewalk vendor must obtain a Sidewalk Vending Permit prior to operating. As part of the Sidewalk Vending Permit application process, vendors must also obtain a City of San Diego Business Tax Certificate, California Seller's Permit, and vendors selling food must also obtain a San Diego County Health Permit and Food Handler Card.

The Sidewalk Vending Permit requirement does not apply to individuals engaged in artistic performances, free speech, political or petitioning activities, or engaged solely in vending items constituting expressive activity protected by the First Amendment and any vendor of services.

Where is sidewalk vending prohibited?

All vendors are prohibited on San Diego Avenue between Conde Street and Twiggs Street; Vending prohibited (500 feet) near any school while children are going to or from the school, during a recess period or within 30 minutes before or after the school's opening or closing hour; and All vendors are prohibited in all State, County, and City parks.



Reminder: No Commercial Waste in Public Bins

We are writing to remind all merchants in Old Town San Diego about the proper disposal of commercial waste. It has come to our attention that there have been instances where commercial waste is being improperly placed in public trash cans, causing inconvenience and potential sanitation issues.

As responsible members of our community, it is crucial to ensure that we dispose of our waste in the appropriate manner. Public trash cans are primarily intended for the disposal of personal garbage generated by visitors. Commercial waste, on the other hand, including waste from your businesses, should not be placed in these public bins.

Download the Get It Done App & Get Results

Get It Done San Diego is the official app for reporting non-emergency problems to the City of San Diego. App users can report problems like potholes or graffiti and connect directly to the City's work tracking system.

Get It Done can be used to report problems related to City assets, making appointments for Passport services or to schedule time at the City's Household Hazardous Waste Materials drop-off facility. Do not use Get It Done for reporting emergencies or other time-sensitive issues. It can take up to 48 hours to review your report or request for appointment.
