Montgomery Steppe will represent the Fourth Supervisorial District for the


remainder of the current term ending in January 2027.

Antonio Garra was a Native
American Patriot who fought
for Southern California and
Northern Baja tribal rights and
sovereignty. He was illegally
executed on January 10, 1852,
by the citizens of California
during a mass anti-Native
American hysteria. When
Garra was asked to state
any last words, he replied,
"Gentlemen, I ask your pardon
for all my offenses and expect
yours in return."

This event is a celebration of Garra's life and others who fought to secure the future of the California Indians during the post-California Mission era. Join them for the testimonies given in celebration of his life.

From 1953 to 2023: The Enduring Legacy of 'Las Posadas' in Old Town San Diego

In the heart of Old Town San Diego, a cherished Christmas tradition has been bringing joy and cultural significance to the community for nearly seven decades. The tradition of hosting "Las Posadas" in this historic neighborhood began in 1953, and it continues to thrive, with the 65th Annual Las Posadas set to take place on Friday, December 8, 2023, at the picturesque Heritage County Park. As the children made their rounds, residents and shopkeepers played their roles by denying the young couple's requests, creating a poignant atmosphere that drew

participants and onlookers alike into the heart of the story.

A Joyous Conclusion:

The Las Posadas tradition in Old Town San Diego extended through December 23, providing a wonderful opportunity for the community to come together and celebrate the holiday season in a unique and meaningful way. On the final evening of the Posadas, the children gathered at one of the neighborhood's restaurants for a Piñata party, adding an extra layer of festivity to the occasion. Download the Get It Done App & Get Results

Get It Done San Diego is the official app for reporting non-emergency problems to the City of San Diego. App users can report problems like potholes or graffiti and connect directly to the City's work tracking system.

Get It Done can be used to report problems related to City assets, making appointments for Passport services or to schedule time at the City's Household Hazardous Waste Materials drop-off facility. Do not use Get It Done for reporting emergencies or other time-sensitive issues. It can take up to 48 hours to review your report or request for appointment.
