The Pala Band of Mission Indians and the First San Diego Courthouse Museum are proud to announce the 2024 Antonio Garra Day, a commemorative event honoring the life and legacy of a true Native American patriot, Antonio Garra.

This special celebration will take place on March 16, 2024, from 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm at the Old Town San Diego State Historic Park, 4002 Wallace Street. Antonio Garra was a significant figure in the fight for the rights and sovereignty of Southern California and Northern Baja tribes. Despite being illegally executed in 1852 amidst anti-Native American hysteria, Garra's legacy as a leader and advocate for his people endures.

This event seeks to celebrate his contributions and the continued resilience of the California Indian communities.

Antonio Garra Day is a family-friendly event that is free and open to the public.

Register for Emergency Alerts

The emergency notification system can make phone calls to people and businesses in San Diego County when there's an emergency or disaster happening or about to happen.

It's used by emergency workers to tell people what's going on and what they should do (like leave their homes, stay inside, or watch out for a gas leak or a missing person). The system can call both listed and unlisted landline phones using the 9-1-1 phone list from the local phone companies.

It can also send alerts to your cell phone, internet phone (VoIP), and email, but only if you register.

Safe Sidewalks Program and Fee Holiday

The Safe Sidewalks Program and Fee Holiday was approved by City Council on November 13, 2023. With the Fee Holiday, over \$2,100 in permitting fees have been removed to make it more cost effective for private property owners to fix sidewalk damages which are their responsibility.

The Transportation Department will be sending out Notice of Responsibility letters in the Old

Town Community Plan Area this month as part of the Safe Sidewalks Program.

These letters will be sent to private property owners with known sidewalk damages that are their responsibility to maintain per California state law.

This Program and Fee Holiday offers private property owners the opportunity to repair the

sidewalk damage without a permit fee via an expedited permit process through June 30, 2026.

Black History in California: Allen Light Sail Protection Papers

Old Town San Diego State Historic Park is a park known for its rich history of California's first Spanish settlement, but it is also rich with Black history as well. It is at this historic park where the story of Allen Light, a free Black man with Mexican citizenship, was rediscovered.

Born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Allen Light came to Santa Barbara, California in 1835 as mariner and became an otter hunter at a time when otter pelts were highly valued. Light temporarily stopped otter hunting in 1836 and obtained his Mexican citizenship in 1839. Soon after, he was appointed game warden by the Governor to help prevent illegal hunting. It was not until 1942 when Light officially stopped otter hunting and settled in San Diego.

Light lived in a building next to La Casa De Machado y Silvas adobe, located on what is today Old Town San Diego State Historic Park, with another free Black man by the name of Richard Freeman. Light and Freeman were the first Black business owners, operating a saloon and dry goods store. Freeman was also appointed the first deputy sheriff of San Diego. When Richard Freeman died in 1951, Allen Light's existence seemed to have vanished. Though there was census conducted that year, Light being a Black man, was not recorded.

In 1948, Allen Light makes his reappearance, but not in person. His name appeared on a hidden paper. A heater was being installed in the Casa de Machado y Silvas adobe, when Light's papers were found buried in the walls. The papers were known as sailor protection papers, similar to "free papers" which most states required Black people to carry at the time. In the documents, Allen was described as a 22-year-old colored man.

Allen Light's legacy was hidden for about 100 years, but it was never meant to be forgotten. Through the discovery of his sailor protection papers, his legacy was found. Light's sailor protection papers can be viewed at the San Diego Historical Society's Research Archives.

Download the Get It Done App & Get Results

Get It Done San Diego is the official app for reporting non-emergency problems to the City of San Diego. App users can report problems like potholes or graffiti and connect directly to the City's work tracking system.

Get It Done can be used to report problems related to City assets, making appointments for Passport services or to schedule time at the City's Household Hazardous Waste Materials drop-off facility. Do not use Get It Done for reporting emergencies or other time-sensitive issues. It can take up to 48 hours to review your report or request for appointment.
